COMMITTEE UNDER ARTICLE 1, PARAGRAPH 2 OF THE AGREEMENT ON THE  
SETTLEMENT OF PROBLEM CONCERNING PROPERTY AND CLAIMS AND ON THE  
ECONOMIC CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA AND JAPAN

Japanese Proposing Note

April 19, 1966

Dear Mr. Kim

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement on the Settlement of Problem concerning Property and Claims and on the Economic Co-operation between Japan and the Republic of Korea, signed at Tokyo on June 22, 1965 (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") and to the exchange of notes of the same date on the Joint committee as provided for in Article 1, paragraph 2 of the Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "the Exchange of notes"), and to propose, on behalf of the government of Japan, that the two Governments agree on the following provisions concerning further details on the organization and functions of the Joint committee;

1. There shall be established in Tokyo two Joint Sub-committees as subordinate organs of the Joint Committee: a Joint Sub-committee with powers to recommend to the Joint Committee on matters concerning the implementation of Article 1, paragraph 1(a) of the agreement (hereinafter referred to as "the Joint Sub-committee No. 2").
2. The Joint Committee, upon agreement of the representatives of the two governments, may delegate some of its functions to either of the Joint Sub-committees.
3. The representative of either Government may call a meeting of the Joint committee or the Joint Sub-committee upon five day 's notice, except in case of emergency. The notices shall include proposed agenda of the meeting.
4. The Joint Sub-committee No. 1 and No. 2 shall be attended by the representatives and/or the deputy representatives of the two Governments to the Joint Committee.

I have further the honour to propose that the present Note and your reply confirming the acceptance by your Government of the above proposal shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments concerning further details on the organization and functions of the Joint Committee.
